WHAT IS HOSPICE

Considered to be the model for quality, compassionate care for serious or life-limiting illness or injury, hospice care involves a teamoriented approach to end-of-life care, pain management, and emotional and spiritual support expressly tailored to patient and family needs and wishes.

WHAT IS PALLIATIVE CARE

Palliative care is patient and family-centered care that optimizes quality of life by anticipating, preventing, and treating pain and suffering. Palliative care can be provided throughout the care continuum and addresses physical, intellectual, emotional, social, and spiritual needs and facilitates patient autonomy and access to information and choice.

WHAT IS HOME HEALTH CARE

Home health care is medical and supportive services provided in a patient's home to help them manage their health conditions, recover from illness or injury, or prevent hospitalization. It is usually less expensive, more convenient, and as effective as care you get in a hospital or skilled nursing facility.

WHAT IS HOME CARE

Home care provides critical home-based care and living support services for individuals young and old, helping them live full, independent, and connected lives in the comfort of wherever they call home. Home care can include medical and non-medical support.

WHAT IS MEDICAID HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES (HCBS)

Medicaid HCBS covers a wide range of supports such as home health, rehabilitation, transportation, nutrition, employment supports, and many others. It is available to many individuals with significant health conditions and/or functional limitations. Services are often a combination of both medical supports, such as home health and private duty nursing, and non-medical services, including personal care, homemaker, and chore services.
